Underdog Pioneers Face Braves

Dearborn's Varsity gridgers, after four straight losses, will be going for their first victory of the season against league opponent Ypsilanti before a homecoming crowd at 4 p. m. today.

Last week Coach Bill Hill initiated a "point" system to evaluate players in drills and practice. However, this does not necessarily mean that players with the most points are the starters. Gridders Meet Edsel Tonight After Ypsi Homecoming Defeat

As the haze settled over the field before the Homecoming game crowd last Friday, Dearborn High gridgers were in the process of losing a hard fought battle to the second-ranked, undefeated Ypsilanti Braves 13-6.

The suspenseful stage was set as the Pioneers were first on the scoreboard when the junior combination of Barry Sawicki and Dave Meisner connected for a 17-yard pass play. The same team followed with a 7-yard touchdown play. When the extra point failed, Dearborn held a 6-0 lead until late in the second quarter.

Ypsi scored and made a successful extra point to hold the half time lead 7-6. Ypsi scored one more time in the third quarter to end scoring.

A 44-yard pass play from Sawicki to senior Gary Sartor put Dearborn in a threatening position inside the ten-yard line. But they failed to score and the game had to be called with 21

seconds left because of darkness.

With the Pioneers' bright showing against Ypsi, they must now look to today's contest against arch rival Edsel Ford. Dearborn is the defend-champion of this annual battle, winning the Gold Football Trophy for the second straight year. Last season Pioneers were awarded this trophy (given to the winner of this particular game) with last year's thrilling 13-7 victory at Edsel Ford. DHS will be looking for a repeat performance paced by seniors Bryan Lowry, Mitch Lingenfelter, and Billy "Bandit" Rieger, and juniors Sawicki and Meisner, who all played an outstanding game last week.

This game, by tradition, is always the big one in spirit and attendance. Edsel Ford posts a 3-2 record coming into this game, losing to Ypsi 17-7, and Waterford Mott 37-7 last week.

The game will begin at 3 p. m. on the DHS football field.
